

Biography / History: Julien Hequembourg Bryan (1899-1974) was an American documentarian and

filmmaker. In the 1930s, he conducted extensive lecture tours, during which he showed film footage he shot in the former USSR. Between 1935 and 1938, he

captured unique records of ordinary people and life in Nazi Germany and in Poland. He was in Warsaw within days of Germany's invasion of Poland in September 1939 and remained throughout the German siege of the city, filming and photographing what

would become America's first cinematic glimpse of the start of WWII.

The train stopped with a lurch. No conductor shouted, "Last stop! All out for Warsaw!"--but it was clear that we had reached the end of our journey. It was one o'clock in the morning, September 7, 1939. I gathered up my cumbersome luggage, including two movie cameras, film and tripod and edged along with my fellow passengers toward what we supposed would be the main hall of the station. But when we descended the train in inky darkness we found that we were not in Warsaw at all, but somewhere on the edge of the city.
