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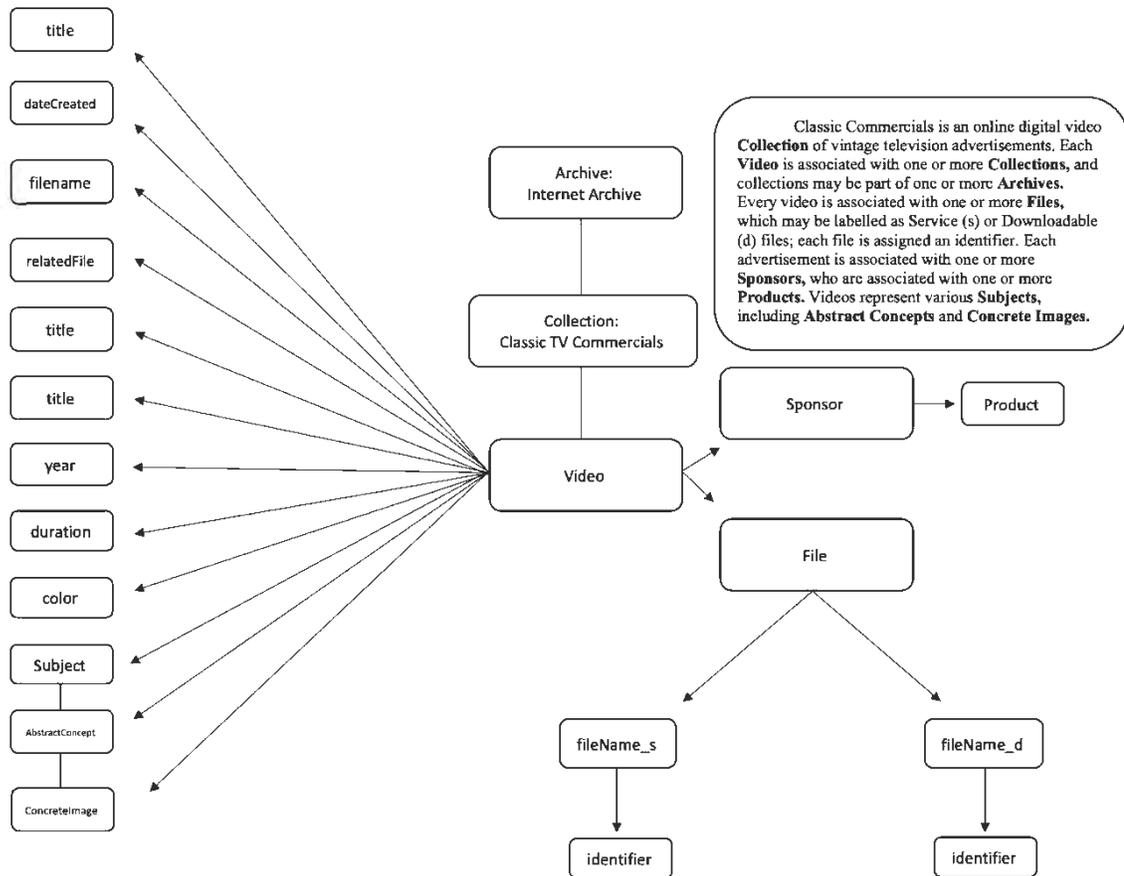
Classic TV Commercials: Collection Overview

This is a compendium of digital copies of vintage and well-known television commercials, which range in date of creation from 1949 to 2003. The bulk of these advertisements are from the mid-twentieth century, and are grouped according to year of release. While most clips were produced in the United-States, several others from the United-Kingdom and Australia are featured.

Memorability and renown, rather than age alone, are factors in the selection and curation of the videos, and for this reason, the clips reveal much about the dominant cultural climate of the time and location of release. A great deal can be learned from these clips about social and political attitudes, corporate and marketing strategy, public relations, and moving image aesthetics. Viewed as a chronological document, this collection demonstrates broad shifts in cultural, social and communications ethics and practices.

One possible user is "The Stranger" a Public Relations scholar at Stanford University researching psychoanalytic themes in mid-century television. She is seeking content that represents certain abstract concepts such as "American Motherhood". Another user, "The Cowboy" is a found-footage filmmaker at UCLA, looking for concrete images of disposable food service products, which he will splice into his works.

Application Profile:

This application profile outlines metadata elements for videos in the Classic TV Commercials collection, created and maintained by the Internet Archive. The goal of the profile is to describe metadata standards and controlled vocabulary to enable interoperability between various schemata. This will enable the more streamlined development of databases to store, as well as interfaces to display and access, the data.

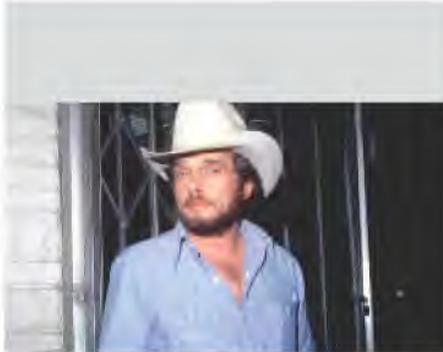
