Initially, the director wanted to become a partner in the colorization of It's a Wonderful Life. However, by March 1985, Capra was denouncing the decision to colorize his film, commenting, "My films were beautifully made in black-and-white, and meant to be in black-and-white. I don't think it's fair to the public to take It's a Wonderful Life, which they like, and have it colorized. The consequences are monetary, and I think the audiences will smell out the truth."
